1.45	Enter Oak timber thick underbrush.
34.00	Leave Oak and enter Fir timber ascending.
40.22	Set post to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner on steep side of mountain, from which
	A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.10*W., 33 lks. dist.
	A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.31*E., 41 lks. dist.
70.45	To point of spur on mountain.
