CHAINS

80.45 Corners of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24.

This mile is rough, mountainous, heavily timbered with Fir, Cedar, Laurel and a variety of underbrush, excepting 34.00 on North end of line, which is principally Oak.

Soil, fine rock, burnt and broken.

Land valuable for its good grazing and timber.

West on Random between secs. 14 and 23.

Va. 19\*E.

40.00 Set temporary  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner and at

80.12 Intersect line 28 lks. South of corner.

Run S.89\*48'E. on true line.

Va. 19\*E.

2.00 Top of Oak ridge, N. and S.

14.00 Dry creek foot of hill.

40.06 Set post to  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec corner, from which

A B. Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears N.20\*E., 26 lks. dist.

A B. Oak 12 ins. diam., bears S.5\*E., 58 lks. dist.

50.00 Dry gulch at foot of hill, N.

51.00 Across vine Maple bottom, foot of mountain.

79.12 Top of mountain.

80.12 Corner to secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24.

This mile is heavily timbered and mountainous.

Soil, valuable for timber only, rocky.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Pine, Laurel and Maple.

July 21, 1871.

North on line between secs. 34 and 35.

Va. 19\*E.

30.00 Timber, descend into canyon.

40.00 Set post to  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner, from which

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.45\*E., 82 lks. dist.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.35\*W., 19 lks. dist.
