32.50	Fence N. and S.
39.25	Ditch, N. and S.
40.00	Set post to $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. corner, from which A Cedar, 4 ins. diam., bears N.58*W., 81 lks. dist. A W. Oak, 3 ins. diam., bears S.35*W., 10 lks. dist.
42.00	Enter timber (descending) Oak and Fir.
42.60	Wagon road, N. and S.
43.00	Fence, N. and S.
46.00	Mr. Knott's house 50 lks. North.
52.00	Fence, enter field of corn, etc.
54.00	Fence, leave field, etc.
80.00	Corner of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35. This mile varies, a part good grazing, good for cultivation and a part heavily timbered and rough as indicated by notes. Timber, Oak, Fir, Laurel and Pine.

10.00	Dodson's mountain (top) N.41*E.
16.50	A spring, Course S.
30.00	Love's field about 10.00 chs. East.
33.00	Commenced descent.
38.00	Enter heavy timber, Fir, Laurel, Oak, etc.
40.00	Set post to $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. corner, from which A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.58*E., 12 lks. dist. A Laurel, 14 ins. diam., bears S.30*W., 27 lks. dist.
46.00	A creek, 1 lks. wide, Course NE.
51.00	Dry gulch, NW.
53.70	A creek, 2 lks. wide, Course W.
80.00	Set corner to secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, from which
