33.50 Brook, 8 lks. wide, running SW.

Began ascending slope.

40.00 Set post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. diam. and 1 ft. in ground,

A Fir, 72 ins. diam., bears S.35\*W., 11 lks. dist.

A Fir, 66 ins. diam., bears S.60\*E., 6 lks. dist.

80.00 Set post 4 ft. long, 5 ins. diam., 1 ft. in the ground,  
for cor. of Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, from which

A Fir, 44 ins. diam., bears S.25\*W., 102 lks. dist.

A Fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S.15\*E., 58 lks. dist.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.70\*W., 154 lks. dist.

No other tree within reach.

Land, rolling.

Soil, third rate.

Timber, good on South  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and  
Yew.

August 3, 1875.

North, between Secs. 19 and 20,

Va. 20\*30'E.

15.00 Summit of steep slope.

A Fir, 42 ins. diam., bears West, 8 lks. dist.

A Chinkapin, 15 ins. diam., bears N.15\*E., 35 lks.  
dist.
