28.60 Brook, 3 lks. wide, runs NE.

40.25 Marked a Fir 4 ins. diam. for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post, from which

A Fir, 46 ins. diam, bears N.70*E., 76 lks. dist.

No other tree within reach.

50.00 Summit of mountain.

80.50 Intersect post at corner of Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18.

Land, broken and mountainous.

Soil, third rate and rocky.

Timber, scattering Fir and Cedar. Fire has destroyed
