

Resurvey of S. Bdy. T. 27 S., R. 7 W.  
(Hathorn Survey)

CHAINS

Land, level.  
Soil, clay loam, 1st rate.  
Timber, a few oaks.  
Undergrowth, oak, ash, and willow.

N, 89°50'W., on S. bdy. of sec. 34.

Over level open land, in Looking Glass Valley.

27.21 Fence, bears N. and S.

27.42 Intersect E. bdy. Daniel Huntley D.L.C., bears N. 0°02' W., 29.70 chas. to NE. cor., and S. 0°02'E., 35.20 cha. to SE. cor.

27.50 Road, bears N. and S.

31.63 Fence, bears N. and S.; enter orchard, same bearing.

39.92 Proportionate distance.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. below the surface of the ground, in cultivated orchard, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 34, with brass cap marked

The two east trees of the north row of trees of the orchard are used as bearing objects, as follows:

The east tree of the north row, a walnut, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 63°E., 41 lks. dist., not marked.

The next tree west in the same row, a walnut, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 71°W., 59 lks. dist., not marked.

The Ford standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 3, re-established and hereafter described, bears N. 83°56'E., 7.29 chs. dist.

The cor. established by Ford for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 34, re-established as angle point, hereafter described, bears N. 15°W., 76 lks. dist.

45.55 Wire fence, bears N. and S.; leave orchard; enter timber and brush, bears N. and S.

48.80 Dry run course S.

52.35 Wire fence, bears N. and S.; enter orchard, same bearing.

57.90 Wire fence, bears N. and S.; leave orchard; enter timber
