

Subdivisions, T. 28 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

Original bearing tree, a black oak, 30 ins. diam., bears N.49½°E., 114. lks. dist. (not N.40°E.), blazes plain, marks grown over.

New bearing trees by county surveyor:

A pine, 16 ins. diam., bears S.4°W., 84 lks. dist., marked ¼ S C S B T.

A laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.53°E., 70 lks. dist., marked ¼ S C S B T.

Could find no trace of the original SE. bearing tree.

Thence from the ¼ sec. cor.

N.82°50'W., bet. secs. 4 and 9.

Descend over SE. slope, 10 ft. along old fence.

13.00 House, bears N.; 40 lks. dist.

15.35 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.; ascend over NE. slope, 158 ft.

21.56 Old road, bears SE. and NW.

24.34 Old road, bears SW. and NE.

29.80 Top of ascent; descend 10 ft.

31.30 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NE.; ascend SE. slope, 159 ft.

38.20 Intersect the point for cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, located by record measurement from the original bearing trees. Marks on all these trees are overgrown, blazes are plain. NE. tree opened.

At the exact cor. point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, with brass cap marked

A black oak, 14 ins. diam., bears N.79°E., 65 lks. dist.

A black oak, 18 ins. diam., bears S.70°E., 64 lks. dist. (not S.33°E.)

A black oak, 30 ins. diam., bears S.80°W., 26 lks.
