A black oak, 22 ins. diam., bears N.21*E., 77 lks. dist. (not N.20*E., 76 lks.)

A black oak, 28 ins. diam., bears S.77 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 140 lks. dist. (not S.75*E.)

A black oak, 24 ins. diam., bears S.70*W., 62 lks. dist. (not S.73*W.)

A black oak, 30 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 5 lks. dist.

At the exact cor. point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for cor. No.2 of this survey, with brass cap marked

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.70*E., 18 lks. dist., marked A P 2 TR 49 B T.
