CHAINS

- 25.78 Intersect cor. No. 4 of this survey, identical with W. 1/16 sec. cor. bet. original secs. 18 and 19, heretofore described.
- Thence
N.0°23'E., along the E. bdy. of Tract No. 52, on the west meridional subdivision line of original sec. 18.
- 20.66 Intersect cor. No. 1 of this survey, identical with cor. No. 4 of Tract No. 51, and place of beginning.

Survey of Tract No. 53.

NW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 30, Fin. Appl. 4536, Feb. 28, 1903, F.C.11314 issued to Lillian J. Miller July 14, 1903, patented 171.89 acres.

- I commence at cor. No. 1 of this survey, identical with the W. 1/16 sec. cor. bet. secs. 19 and 30, heretofore described.
- Thence
N.80°27'W., along the N. bdy. of Tract No. 53, bet. original secs. 19 and 30.
- 21.21 Intersect E. bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 8 W. at the resurvey cor. of secs. 19 and 30, T. 29 S., R. 7 W., hereafter described.
- 23.45 Intersect the point for the Ford Cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, located by measurement from the original bearing trees, as follows:
- A black oak, 24 ins. diam., bears S.21°E., 37 lks. dist. (not S.25°E.)
 - A black oak, 24 ins. diam., bears N.83°W., 67 lks. dist., marks on both these trees grown over and not opened.
 - A laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears S.67°W., 75 lks. dist. (not S.70°W.), marks rotted away.
 - A laurel stump, bears N.12°E., 90 lks. dist. (not 100 lks.)
