CHAINS

- 9.65 Descend along top of spur, slopes S.
 13.45 Leave top of spur, slopes SE.; descend SW. slope,
 18.45 Head of draw, course SW.
 27.21 Intersect the line bet. Tracts Nos. 53 and 54, S.80*16'E.,
 2.60 chs. from the N. 1/16 sec. cor. on the W. bdy. of
 sec. 30, T 29 S., R. 7 W., heretofore described.
 28.75 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; ascend NE. slope, 308 ft.
 39.75 Intersect the point for Hathorn cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25,
 and 30, located by measurement from the original bear-
 ing trees.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins, in
 the ground, for cor. of secs. 24 and 25 only, with
 brass cap marked

- A laurel, bears N.25*E., 56 lks. dist., rotted
 down, stump shows position.
- A laurel 16 ins. diam., bears S.42*E., 46 lks.
 dist., marks grown over, blazes plain.
- A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 6 lks. dist.,
 marks are plain on the bark.
- A laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.42*W., 40 lks.
 dist., marks grown over, blazes are plain.

New bearing trees:

- A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S.15*W., 60 lks.
 dist., marked T 29 S R 8 W S 25 B T.
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.65*W., 48 lks. dist.,
 marked T 29 S R 8 W S 24 B T.

Land, rolling and mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, oak, and laurel.

Undergrowth, fir, oak, hazel, and laurel.
