Retracements

From the Ford cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 S., Rs. 7 and 8 W., S.89°40'E., retracing the S. bdy. of sec. 31; at 43.20 chs., after careful, prolonged and exhaustive search, I am unable to find any trace of the old $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., set temp. cor., and at 78.94 chs. fall 147 lks. S. of the old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32.

S.89°40'E., retracing the S. bdy. of sec. 32; at 38.70 chs. fall 144 lks. S. of the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., and at 78.70 chs. find no trace of the old cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, set temp. cor.

From the temp. cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, S.89°40'E., retracing the S. bdy. of sec. 33; at 37.02 chs. fall 111 lks. S. of the old $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., and at 76.51 chs. fall 138 lks. S. of the old cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33, and 34.

S.89°40'E., retracing the S. bdy. of sec. 34; at 38.09 chs. fall 44 lks. S. of the old $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., and at 77.15 chs. fall 52 lks. N. of the old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35.

S.89°40'E., retracing Ford's S. bdy. of sec. 35; at 40.00 chs. find no evidence of the Ford $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., and at 78.26 chs. fall 39 lks. N. of the Ford cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36.

S.89°40'E., retracing Ford's S. bdy. of sec. 36; at 38.46 chs. fall 57 lks. N. of the Ford $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.; continue retracement to 78.46 chs., after extended search, find no trace of any cor. in this vicinity, The reputed Ford cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 S., Rs. 6 and 7 W., accepted by Flint in the survey of T. 30 S., R. 6 W.; by Byars in survey of T. 30 S., R. 7 W.; by Mensch in survey of T. 29 S., R. 6 W.; and by Campbell in survey of T. 29 S., R. 7 W., bears from this cor. point by calculation from the notes of Wm. B. Douglas, Examiner of Surveys, approximately S.46°45'E., 23.75 chs. dist. I make no connection with this cor., as it does not affect the procedure under this group.

I commence at the Ford cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 S., Rs. 7 and 8 W., located by measurement from the original bearing trees.

At the exact cor. point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for witness point, with brass cap marked

from which (the original bearing trees)

A laurel stump, bears S.50°E., 24 lks. dist.

A laurel stump, bears S.35°W., 17 lks. dist.

A laurel, 30 ins. diam., bears N.50°W., 25 lks. dist., marks are legible.

The NE. bearing tree is entirely destroyed.
