later determined.

the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32 only, T. 29 $\frac{1}{2}$
S., R. 7 W., with brass cap marked

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in
the ground, for cor. of secs. 32 and 33, with brass
cap marked

A laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.36*E., 43 lks.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.72*W., 16 lks. dist.,

Land, rolling and mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, laurel, oak, chinquapin, and pine.

Undergrowth, hazel, vinemaple, laurel, oak, and fir.

S.89*25'E., along the S. bdy. of sec. 33.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense under-
growth.

Ascend NW. slope, 158 ft.

6.35 Top of spur, slopes NW.; descend along N. slope, 117 ft.
