General Description

T. 27 S., R. 7 W.

The east half of the south boundary of this township extends across Looking Glass Valley, long settled, cultivated, and improved land. The remainder of the line runs across hilly land, covered with brush and timber, generally unimproved.

Section 33 occupies hilly land and has few permanent improvements.

The postoffice of Looking Glass is located at the quarter section corner of Sections 35 and 36.

Tps. 28 and 29 S., R. 7 W.

Townships 28 and 29 S., Range 7 W. are mostly rough and mountainous land, especially in the eastern portions.

There are several donation land claims in the western portions along the boundaries, where most of the work on this group was done.

This fractional township is a hiatus between the Ford south boundary of T. 29 S., R. 7 W. and the Byars north boundary of T. 30 S., R. 7 W. and extends East and West 4 miles, and North and South about
