

Portion of the North Bdy, of T. 30 S., R. 1 W.,

CHAINS

- Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- Desc. NW. slope.
- 33.50 Enter brushy opening known as Rattlesnake Burn.
- Thence along top of ridge bears E. and W.
- 43.53 Set a basalt stone 12x10x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face., from which
- A yellow pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N.30*W., 85 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 34 B. T.
- A yellow pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S.45*E., 87 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B. T.
- 53.50 Ridge point. Desc steep W. slope.
- 63.00 Enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.
- 83.53 A cedar, 10 ins. diam., for cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34,
I mark
T 29 S S 34 on NE.
R 1 W S 3 on SE.
T 30 S S 4 on SW. and
S 33 on NW. side, with 3 notches on E. and W. sides.,
From which
- A red fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.70*E., 59 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 34 B. T.
- A red fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.10*E., 49 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 1 W S 3 B. T.
- A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears S.54*W., 19 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 1 W S 4 B. T.
- A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.56*W., 48 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 33 B. T.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, loam and stony, second and third rate.
- Timber, red and white fir, cedar, sugar and yellow pine.
- Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, hinguapin, and arrowwood.
- Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 83.53 chs.
- N.89*53'E. bet. secs. 4 and 33.
- Over mountainous land heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.
- 0.58 The cor. which I established under contract No. 757 as the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, bears N. 34 lks. dist.,
