	I destroy the cor. and marks on bearing trees.
34.50	Trail bears N. and S.
35.10	John Rondean's cabin on line.
35.50	Creek, 2 lks wide, course SE.
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 15x10x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face., from which A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.59*E., 5 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B. T. A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.51*W., 11 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 B. T.
40.65	The C. which I established under contract No. 757, as the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 4 and 33, bears N. 20 lks. dist., I destroy marks on corner and bearing tree.
46.10	Trail bears N. and S.
55.75	North Fork of South Umpqua River, 100 lks. wide, Course S. 20* W. Asc. steep NW. slope.
80.00	The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34. Land, mountainous. Soil, loam and stony, 2nd. and 3rd. rate. Timber, red and white fir, sugar and yellow pine, cedar. Undergrowth, oak, hazel, vine maple and arrowwood. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs. November 10, 1907.
	I commence at the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. Bdy. of the T. which I re-established, Aug 6, 1905 Thence I run N.89*53'E. on a blank line on N. Bdy. of T. 30 S. R. 1 W. at 160 chs. intersect cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, which I established. Nov. 9, 1907.
