

## Portion of West Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 1 W.,

9.37	Hunters' trail bears NE. and SW.
9.98	Creek, 2 lks wide, course SW.
10.50	Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
21.50	Leave heavy timber, bears E. and W.
29.48	Trail bears NW. and SE.
33.00	Trail bears NE. and SW.
34.00	Enter small swamp.
34.80	Leave swamp.
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 12x8x6 ins. 8 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W, face., from which A red fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.86*E., 59 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B. T. A red fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.73*W., 178 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B. T.
52.00	Summit of divide bet. Deadman and Dumore Bar creeks., bears NW. and SE. Desc. NE. slope. Enter heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.
80.00	Set a porphyry stone, 18x9x6 ins. 12 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, marked with 2 notches on N. and 4 notches on S. edge., from which A white fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.70*E., 89 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 7 B. T. A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S.43*E., 14 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 18 B. T. A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S.65*W., 8 lks, dist., marked T 29 S R 2 W S 13 B. T. A red fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.32*W., 59 lks, dist., marked T 29 S R 2 W S 12 T. B.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This line, for the greater part of its distance, runs nearly parallel with the long ridge which forms the divide between Deadman Creek and the North Fork of the South Umpqua River, along the West slope to Deadman Creek. This slope is sparsely timbered, and is covered for the most of its extent with dense undergrowth.

The adjoining range of sections in T.29 S., R.2 W., contains some land suitable for agricultural purposes, principally in secs. 24 and 25.

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
