42.30	Summit of ridge bears NW. and SE. Desc. NE. slope.
49.10	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course E.
51.90	Leave heavy timber, bears NW. and SE. Enter brushy openings known as Dumore Bar Burn.
56.00	Enter heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.
69.50	Edge of perpendicular precipice 50 ft. high.
80.00	Set a basalt stone, 20x15x6 ins. 15 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, marked with 4 notches on S. and 3 notched on E. edge, from which A red fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.13*E., 42 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 10 B. T. A red fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.10*E., 28 lks. dist. marked T 29 S R 1 W S 15 B. T. A maple, 6 ins. diam., bears S.13*W., 94 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 16 B. T. A sugar pine, 15 ins. diam., bears N.15*W., 27 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 9 B. T. Land, mountainous. Soil, lean and stoney, 2nd. and 3rd. rate. Timber, red and white fir, sugar pine and cedar.
