CHAINS	
	Thence I run South 89°42'W. on a true line bet. secs. 28 and 33. Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth. Asc. steep creek bluff facing NE.
1.50	Top of bluff.
15.10	Settlers' trail bears N. and S.
39.85	The cor. which I established in my original survey under contract No. 757 as the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 28 and 33, bears N. 15 lks. dist. I destroy the cor. and marks on bearing trees.
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 12x12x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground. for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.36°W., 18 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 28 B. T. A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.18°E., 22 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B. T.
45.50	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.
47.25	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.
49.75	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.
65.50	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.
80.14	The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33. Land, mountainous. Soil, loam and stoney, 2nd. and 3rd. rate. Timber, red and white fir, yellow and sugar pine and cedar. Undergrowth, hazel, vine maple, arrowwood and fir. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.14 chs.
