40.55	Set a basalt stone, 18x10x10 ins. 12 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which A red fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.60*E., 77 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 B T. A red fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.3*E., 99 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T.
51.80	Top of steep rock bluff.
53.00	Foot of bluff.
59.00	Enter swamp.
