40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.45 Intersect W. bdy of the Tp. 5 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which I established August 17, 1905.

hence I run

N.89*45'E., on a true line bet. secs. 18 and 19.

Over mountainous land through dense undergrowth.

2.45 Enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.

10.55 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW.

11.65 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW.

Asc. W. slope.

31.50 Summit of divide bet. Deadman Creek, and N. Fork of South Umpqua River, bears NW. and SE.

Desc. E. slope.

40.45 Set a porphyry stone, 20x15x10 ins. 15 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which

A red fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.38'E., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B T.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears South 21 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T.

40.60 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NE.
