50.00 Top of ascent, 75 ft. above brook.
 The W. end of hay field extends N. 5.00 chs.

58.60 Fence, bears NW. and SE.

59.60 Fence, bears N. and S.
 East end of hay field extends N. 5.00 chs.

70.00 Top of ridge, bears N. and S. 400 ft. above brook.

80.00 A sugar pine, 24 ins. diam., for cor. of secs. 35 and 36,
 I mark T 29 S S 36 on NE. and
 R 1 W S 35 on NW. side, with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches
 on W. side, from which
 A sugar pine, 24 ins. diam., bears N.35*E., 8 lks.
 dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 36 B T.
 A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.53*W., 52 lks. dist.,
 marked T 29 S R 1 W S 35 B T.

Land, level, rolling and hilly.
 Soil, clay loam and 2nd. rate.
 Timber, pine, fir, hemlock and cedar.
 Undergrowth, small pine, fir, hemlock, cedar, willow
 and hazel.

S.89*40'E. on S. Bdy. sec. 36.
 Descend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.62 Intersect the cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T. 30 S., R. 1 W.
 which is an old post marked and witnessed as described
 by the Surveyor General.

I destroy the old post and in its place
 Set a basalt stone, 15x10x6 ins. 10 ins. in the ground
 for cor. of secs. 1 and 2, marked with 1 notch on E.
 edge, and 5 notches on W. edge.

Thence I run
 East, on S. Bdy. of Sec. 36, counting distance from the
 cor. of secs. 35 and 36.
