CHAINS

- for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which
- A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.63*E., 94 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 B T.
- A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.59*W., 45 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 27 B T.
- 43.00 Foot of desc, bears NE. and SW., 300 ft. below top of spur.
- 54.00 Enter old burn, bears NE. and SW.
- 70.00 Descend.
- 74.00 Leave burn and enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
- 77.25 Top of rock bluff, 50 ft. high, bears NE. and SW.
- 78.00 Foot of bluff.
- 80.00 Set a basalt stone, 22x10x6 ins. 17 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, marked with 2 notches on S. and E. edges, from which
- A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.22*E., 59 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 23 B T.
- A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.5*E., 75 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 26 B T.
- A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.47*W., 47 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 27 B T.
- A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.37 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 59 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 22 B T.
- Land, mountainous and level.
- Soil, clay loam and stony, 3rd. and 4th. rates.
- Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar.
- Undergrowth, small fir, hemlock, yew, vine maple, cherry and chinquapin.
