

## Subdivisional Lines of T. 29 S., R. 1 W.,

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and stony, 3rd. and 4th. rates.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, small fir, laurel, hemlock, rhododendron and chinquapin.

August 4, 1910.

At the cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.

Thence I run

N.0°2'W., bet. secs. 14 and 15.

Ascend along steep W. slope through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 2.00 Enter old burn, bears NE. and SW.
- 19.00 Top of asc. on W. slope, 200 ft. above the sec. cor.  
Thence across W. slope.
- 24.00 Enter a grove of small fir, bears E. and W.
- 26.05 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course W.
- 26.25 Leave grove, bears E. and W.
- 36.00 Descend.
- 38.00 Enter small timber, bears E. and W.
- 40.00 Set a basalt stone, 14x8x6 ins. 10 ins. in the ground,  
for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face, from which  
A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.52°E., 8 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 14 B T.  
A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.38°W., 23 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 15 B T.
- 41.00 A branch, 1 lk. wide, 200 ft. below the point of desc.,  
course W.
- 47.00 Leave timber and enter burn, bears E. and W.
- 78.00 Enter small timber, bears E. and W.
