 East on a random line bet. secs. 10 and 15.
 40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
 76.20 Intersect N. and S. line at the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14
 and 15.
 Thence I run
 West on a true line bet. sec. 10 and 15.
 Desc. through small timber and dense brush.
 4.50 A marshy spring, course SW.
 Thence over sloping bench.
 35.40 Top of abrupt desc., bears N. and S.
 40.00 A fir, 6 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 on N.
 side and 15 on S. side, from which
 A pine, 8 ins. diam., bears N.76*E., 40 lks. dist.,
 marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 B T.
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.66*E., 25 lks. dist.,
 marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 B T.
