## CHAINS

45.00 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.  
 62.10 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.  
 73.20 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.  
 75.50 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.  
 80.00 My line falls 48 lks. W. of the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27  
 and 28, heretofore described.  
 The line bears N.0°39'E.

N.0°2'W., retracing the line bet. secs. 21 and 22.  
 Across E. slope through heavy timber and dense under-  
 growth.

8.40 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SE.

Ascend from creek.

40.02 My line falls 48 lks. W. of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. which is a  
 stone, 8x6x4 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and  
 witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

The line bears N.0°39'E.

Thence from the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

N.0°2'W., bet. secs. 21 and 22.

43.00 Top of ridge, 900 ft. above the River, bears E. and W.  
 Descend.

56.20 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course NE.

63.80 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course NE.

72.50 Enter burnt timber, bears NE. and SW.

80.00 My line falls 48 lks. W. of the cor. of secs. 15, 16,  
 21 and 22, heretofore described.

N.0°2'W., retracing the line bet. secs. 15 and 16.  
 Desc. through burnt timber.

7.50 Leave burnt and enter green timber, bears NE. and SW.

9.60 Branch, 3 lks. wide, course NE.

10.40 Branch, 4 lks. wide, course E., 400 ft. below the sec. cor.  
 Asc. steep rocky slope.
