

Resurvey of the S. Bdy. T. 28 S., R. 1 W.,

46.20	Slick creek, 18 lks. wide, course SE., asc. abrupt W. slope, 368 ft.
47.75	Trail, bears NW. and SE.
47.90	Point for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, hereinafter described.
64.65	Top of asc. desc. along S. slope, 50 ft. to
69.90	Draw, course SW., continue asc. of abrupt W. slope, 404 ft. to
80.72	Intersect the old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a basalt stone, 5x12x10 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edge, and witnessed as follows: <div style="margin-left: 40px;"> <p>A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 84° E., 60 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 1 W S 36 B T. (Old B T.)</p> </div> <p>I change this cor. to refer to secs. 35 and 36 only, and obliterate marks on the old SE. and SW. bearing trees.</p>

	Soil, rocky clay loam, 4th. rate.
	Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock and chinquapin.
	Undergrowth, salal, vine maple, and rhododendron.
	East, along the S. Bdy. of sec. 36.
	Asc. W. slope, 180 ft. through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
5.80	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., desc. E. and SE. slopes 911 ft. to creek.
7.18	Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, later determined. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, with brass cap marked
