A sugar pine, 15 ins. diam., bears S.51*E., 17 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 17 B T. (Old B T.)
 A sugar pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S.64*W., 29 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 W S 18 B T. (New B T.)

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, sandy loam and vegetable mold, 1st. rate.
 Timber, fir, chinquapin, and sugar pine.
 Undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, and huckleberry.

S.88*55'E., along the N. Bdy. of sec. 17.

Desc. SE. slope, 39 ft. through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.22 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N., asc. gradual NW. slope. 181 ft.

28.60 Top of ridge, bears NE, and SW., desc. abrupt SE. slope, 279 ft.

38.96 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 8 only, with brass cap marked

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N.83*E., 36 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 8 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 42 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 8 B T.

40.30 Intersect the old 1/4 sec. cor., which is a basalt stone, 18x10x8 ins. firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I obliterate the marks on the NW. bearing tree and change this cor. to refer to sec. 17 only. Reset the stone, 12 ins. in the ground,
