Soil, rocky clay loam, 4 th. rate.

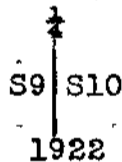
Timber, fir, cedar, pine, chinquapin and madrona.

dense undergrowth.

- 6.67 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.
- 19.76 Creek, 6 lks. wide, course NE.
- 28.23 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.
- 31.00 A point of spur, slopes NE.
- 34.88 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course E.
- 39.12 Dumore Creek, 30 lks. wide, course SE., thence along W.
slope.
- 40.94 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., determined as hereafter set forth.
