and the slopes are more gentle. All of the openings are covered with dense growth of timber ferns. There is a considerable burn in secs. 9 and 10, locally known as, "Ray Burn". The bottom land along Boulder Creek, 5 and 6 chains wide is very heavily timbered.

Some prospecting has been done along Dumore Creek, but no evidence of mineral was found.

The soil is a fair quality of clay loam, well watered, and where not too steep or rocky would probably produce fair crops. The elevation ranges from 2000 to 4000 feet.

The average mean magnetic declination is $21\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.
