

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

A. Portion of the West Boundary of T.29 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

August 16: At 5 p.m., l.m.t., I set off 43*2' on the lat arc; 13*44' on the decl arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor of secs 19,24,25 and 30.

August 16, 1905

August 17: at 8 a.m., l. m. t., I set off 43*2' on the lat arc; 13*32' N on the decl arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor of secs 19, 24, 25, and 30.

Thence I run

North bet secs 19 and 24.

Over mountainous land through dense undergrowth.

Along W slope.

- 2.75 Hunter's and settlers trail bears E and W.
- 3.00 Enter brushy opening known as Big Burn.
- 40.00 Set a basalt stone 15x9x6 ins 10 ins in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face; from which
 - A red fir 20 ins diam bears N 20*E 79 lks dist marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T.
 - A red fir 6 ins diam bears S 65*W 185 lks dist marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 B T.
- 44.42 Hunter*s trail bears NW and SE.
- 59.61 Trail bears NE and SW.
- 66.15 Trail bears NW and SE.
- 71.50 Enter heavy timber, bears E and W.
- 80.00 Set a basalt stone 20x12x10 ins 15 ins in the ground for cor of secs 13, 18, 19 and 24, marked with 3 notches on N and S edges; from which
 - A sugar pine 40 ins diam bears N 18*E 122 lks dist marked T 29 S R 1 W S 18 B T.
 - A red fir 10 ins diam bears S 55*E 123 lks dist marked T 29 S R 1 W S 19 B T.
 - A red fir 24 ins diam bears S 3*W 89 lks dist marked T 29 S R 2 W S 24 B T.
 - A red fir 6 ins diam bear N. 5*W 98 lks dist marked T 29 S R.2 W S 13 B T.
