

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

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A Portion of the West Boundary of T. 29 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loam and stony, 2nd^{rate} and 3rd rate.Timber, red and white fir, sugar and yellow pine, cedar; undergrowth, arrowwood, chin^{quapin}, fir, laurel, willow.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

August 17: At this corner I set off 13*28' N. on the decl arc and at 12h, 4m, 1. m. t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat is 43*3' or nearly the proper lat.

North bet secs 13 and 18.

Over mountainous land through dense undergrowth.

Along W slope.

Enter Big Burn.

9.37 Hunter's trail bears NE and SW.

9.98 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW.

10.50 Enter heavy timber, bears E and W.

21.50 Leave heavy timber, bears E and W.

29.48 Trail bears NW and SE.

33.00 Trail bears NE and SW.

34.00 Enter small swamp.

34.80 Leave swamp.

40.00 Set a basalt stone 12x8x6 ins 8 ins in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face; from whichA red fir 16 ins. diam bears N.86*E 59 lks. dist marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B T.A red fir 20 ins. diam bears S73*W 178 lks. dist marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B T.

52.00 Summit of divide bet Deadman and Dumore Bar creeks bears NW and SE.

Desc NE slope.

Enter heavy timber, bears NW and SE.

80.00 Set a porphyry stone 18x9x6 ins 12 ins. in the ground for cor of secs 7, 12, 13 and 18, marked with 2 notches on N and 4 notches on S edge, from which
