- 73.10 Spring branch, course NE.
- 76.30 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE.
- 76.38 Set a basalt stone, 18x12x10 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 36, T. 28 S., R. 2 W. only, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face; from which
- A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.22*45'E., 51 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T.
- A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.21*W., 56 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T.
- 80.00 The NE. cor. of T. 29 S., R 2 W.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, rocky, 3rd rate.
- Timber, fir, pine and hemlock.
- Undergrowth, maple, rhododendron and chinquapin.

Subdivision of T. 29 S., R. 2 W.

From the cor. of Secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., previously described.

N.0*08'E., on a Sectional Guide Meridian, bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Descend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 7.40 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course, E., ascend SE. slope.
- 9.75 Top of ascend; along E. slope.
- 22.52 Descend over cliffs, bears E. and W.
- 24.50 Deadman Creek, 30 lks. wide, course SE.; along W. slope.
- 36.86 Same creek, course SW.; ascend.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
