A Laurel, 15 ins. diam., bears S.25*E., 14 lks.
 dist.

42.50 Top of ridge.

65.00 Descend to the head of ravine, course S.

80.00 Set Post, cor. of Secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12., from which

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.50*E., 31 lks.
 dist.

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.42*E., 70 lks.
 dist.

A Fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N.57*W., 70 lks.
 dist.

A Redwood, 30 ins. diam., bears S.57 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 65 lks.
 dist.

Land, hilly, 3rd rate.
