

Subdivisions of Fractional T. 29 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

West, on Random line between Secs. 6 and 7.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post.

79.50 Intersect W. bdy. 85 lks. N. of cor.
N.89°24'E., on True line between Secs. 6 & 7.

30.00 Leave Oak openings and enter Fir timber, on summit of ridge, C. N. & S. +500

39.50 Set $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post, from which
 A Fir, 10 ins. in diam., bears S.60°W., 25 lks. dist.
 A Laurel, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.10°W., 56 lks. dist.

58.65 Dry bed of branch, 5 lks. wide, C. SE. -500

60.00 Enter Oak timber, C. N. & SE. +25

79.50 To sec. cor. +400

Land, more open than last mile, otherwise about the same.

North, between Secs. 5 and 6.

10.00 Summit of ridge, C. NE. & SW.

38.00 Enter fir timber, C. NW. & SE.

40.00 Marked a Laurel stub, 12 ins. in diam., for ~~1/4~~ ^{1/2} Sec. cor.,
 from which
 A Laurel, 20 ins. in diam., bears N.18°E., 47 lks. dist.
 A Laurel, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.8°W., 45 lks. dist.

Land, about the same as last mile.

North of this $\frac{1}{4}$ post, land is too rough and hilly for settlement or cultivation.
