CHAINS

quantity of 1st class lands along Myrtle Creek and its tributaries. There are four settlements made in the Township, viz: in Sections 4 and 5. Also a good sawmill in Section 5.

The land, not included in the narrow bottoms along the Creek is generally mountainous, covered with a dense growth of timbers, chiefly Fir, Cedar, Pine, Laurel, Oak, Maple, Alder, Chinquapin, Yew, Ash, etc.

SOUTH Boundary.

I begin at the corner to Tps. 29 and 30 S., Rs. 3 and 4 W., which is a Cedar post, 4 ins. sq. marked:

T 29 S S31 on NE

R 3 W S 6 on SE

T 30 S S 1 on SW

R 4 W S36 on NW faces, with 6 notches

on each edge; and run West on a Random line along South boundary of Section 36.

Var. 19°20'E.

38.72 $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. bears North 109 lks.

77.52 Intersect N. and S. line South 137 lks. of cor. to Secs. 35 and 36.

The post set for this corner is gone, but all the bearing trees are still standing and easily identified by their marks. I restore this corner by setting a Fir post, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked:

T 29 S R 4 W on N. face,
