32.00	Enter Oak openings.	
36.00	A trail, once laid out as County road, C. SE and NW. Va. 21*15'E.

19.00	Foot of descent, begin ascending, leave Fir timber, enter Pine timber.	-150
26.50	Top of rise, begin descending burnt hill	+60
30.00	Foot of descent, begin rising. Va. 18*5'E.	-30
34.00	Top of spur, C. N. 30*W. and S. 30*E., begin descending in an old and again lately fired burn.	+80
