Ascend mountain

3.45 Summit of Main divide between the two Myrtle Creeks, C.
W. about 1200 ft. above the valley land.

Descend.

11.00 Dry bed of stream, C. NW.

14.95 Low ridge, C. NW.

26.45 Dry bed of stream, C. NW.

32.90 Sharp bend, same stream, C. NW.

41.45 To $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. between Secs. 17 and 18.

Land mountainous.

Soil, stony, 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Laurel and Oak, principally Fir.

Underbrush, dense.

In establishing the lines between Secs. 8 and 17, and 17 and 18, I find that said lines varies more than 50 links, the prescribed limit with the reported length of the South boundary of Sec. 17, also the East boundary of Sec. 17, and in that case my Special instructions from the U.S. Surveyor General, requires me to retrace such portions of the boundaries of Sections 8, 17 and 18, as will be necessary in order to prove the accuracy of my work.
