CHAINS

Underbrush; Oak, Laurel & Hazel.

The southwest portion of this township is not worth subdividing, being composed of high peaks of mountains, thickly timbered with fir, pine, etc. I therefore commence at the cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 & 27 and run S.89°42'W., on true line bet. secs. 22 and 27.

A B. Oak, 12 ins. diam., bears N.63°W., 63
lks. dist.

A B. Oak, 18 ins. diam., bears S.37°E., 84
lks. dist.

43.50 A Small Stream, 8 lks. wide, course N.30°W.

59.00 Left bottom, bears S.25°E. & N.43°W.

Entered hills.

80.00 Set a post, cor. secs. 21, 22, 27 & 28, from which:

A B. Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears S.59 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 37
lks. dist.

A B. Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N.50°E., 58
lks. dist.

A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.40°W., 14
lks. dist.

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.42°W., 7
lks. dist.

Hilly land, second rate soil, bottom

First rate timber; fir, oak pine and cedar.

Underbrush; oak and hazel.

Va. 18°10'E.
