

## Subdivision of T. 29 S. R. 6 W.

CHAINS	N.89*42'E. on a random line bet. secs. 29 and 32.
40.00	Set temp. 1/4 sec. cor.
77.25	Intersect N. and S. line, 5 lks. S. of cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33. This corner is nearly obliterated. The old cor, which was a post, has disappeared; the fir and the laurel described as bearing trees in secs. 28 and 33 are still standing with marks yet distinguishable; the other bearing trees have fallen and decayed. I destroy the old marks and re-establish the corner in its original position, as follows:  Set a limestone, 15 x 12 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, marked with 1 notch on S. and 4 notches on E. edge, from which:  A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears N.25*E., 44 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 28 B T  A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears S.26*E., 44 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 33 B T  A Red Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.66*W., 65 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 32 B T  A Chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears N.44*W., 53 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 29 B T  Thence I run S.89*40'W. on a true line bet. secs. 29 and 32. Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.  Asc. E. Slope.
27.25	Summit of ridge, bears N. and S. Thence over rolling ground.
38.25	Settlers' trail bears NW. and SE.
40.00	A Red Fir, 8 ins. diam., for 1/4 sec. cor. I marked 1/4 S 29 on N. and 32 on S. side, from which:  A Chinquapin, 16 ins. diam., bears N.16*W., 56 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 29 B T  A Cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 40 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 32 B T
41.50	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.  Asc. E. Slope.
63.25	Summit of divide, bet. Rice and Willis creeks, bears N. and S.  Desc. West Slope.
77.25	The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32. Land, mountainous- Soil; clay & stony, 2nd. & 3rd. rate. Timber; red & white fir, sugar & yellow pine, cedar & Laurel.- Undergrowth; chinquapin, vine maple, arrow-wood.
