CHAINS 63.55	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N.
68.75	Settlers' trail bears N. and S.
72.00	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.
75.53	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW. Asc. W. slope.
85.25	Settlers' trail bears NE. and SW.
86.45	The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32. Land, mountainous. Soil, clay and stony, 2nd. and 3rd. rate. Timber; red fir, sugar, yellow pine, cedar and laurel. Undergrowth; arrow wood, hazel, vine-maple. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 86.45 chs.
40.00	S.0*2'E. on a random line bet. secs. 31 and 32. Set temp 1/4 sec. cor.
79.85	Intersect S. bdy. of the Tp. 11.70 chs. S.89*38'E. of the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, which is a post, greatly decayed, witnessed as described by the Surveyor general. Set an ironstone 24 x 14 x 12 ins. 18 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, marked CC on N, with 5 grooves on E. and 1 groove on W. face, from which: A red fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N.63'E., 45 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 32 B T A red fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 20 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 6 W S 31 B T I destroy marks on former corner and bearing trees re- ferring to these secs.
