GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Sections 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33, in this township, lie on the slopes of the mountain known as Baldy, from which the tributaries of Rice Creek flow north, those of Willis creek flow northeast and those of Olalla creek southwest. The greater portion of the tract is on the north of Rice creek slope. The extreme eastern portion is on the slope to Willis creek and the extreme southern portion is on the Olalla slope. The tract is wholly mountainous, being mainly a succession of ridges and canyons, with some small creek bottoms and plateaux. It is heavily timbered for the most part and nearly the whole area is covered with dense undergrowth and the tract is exceedingly difficult to survey.

The timber of this district is of good quality and many of the red firs and sugar pines attain a very large size. The red and white fir are the most plentiful woods, the growth of pine being sparse. There is also considerable cedar and some of the ridges have good growths of laurel.

The tract is well, but not copiously, watered. The northern portion may be irrigated from Rice Creek. No mineral deposits of value have been found in this
