GENERAL DESCRIPTION

tract. Olalla creek has produced some gold. Indications of nickel have been found in sec. 31. G. H. Baker has a neat and well kept place in sec 30, with house, barn and other buildings and five or six acres under cultivation in this section. H. M. Barrett has some 40 acres under fence in secs. 29 & 30, with perhaps 15 acres under cultivation, a good house, barn and other buildings, four or five head of horses and a small herd of cattle. There are also three settlers in sec 32.

Re-Establishment of corners in T. 29 S., R 6 W. by Fred Mensch, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under date of December 4, 1905.

The corner of secs. 5 and 6, on the S. Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 6 W. being partially obliterated, I re-establish this corner in its original position, as follows:

Set a diorite stone 18x15x8 ins. 12 ins. in the ground for cor of secs 5 and 6, marked with 5 notches on E and 1 notch on W edge; from which:

A White Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.70*E., 28

lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 6 W S 5 B T

A Red Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.40*W., 29

lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 6 W S 6 B T

The cor of secs 4 and 5, on the South bdy of T 29 S., R 6 W, being partially obliterated, I re-establish this corner in its original position, as follows:

Set a limestone 18x10x10 ins. 12 ins. in the ground for cor of secs. 4 and 5, marked with 4 notches on E. & 2 notches on W. edge, from which:

A Red Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.66*E., 43
lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 6 W S 4 B T

A Red Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.7*W., 25
lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 6 W S 5 B T
