



Re-Survey of W. Bdy. of T. 29 S. R. 6 W.

CHAINS

A Maple, 20 ins. diam., bears N.35*W., 23 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 7 W S 24 B T.

July 28, 1905.

At the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, on the W. bdy. of the Tp.

Though subdivisional lines have not been closed on either side of the southern portion of this range line, yet the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 36, T. 29 S. R. 7 W, is held in private ownership as deeded land.

Therefore I run

S.2*30'W. on a true line bet. secs. 25 and 30.

Along creek bottom through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.00 Leave creek bottom.

Ascend along ravine, course N.

26.50 Summit of ridge, bears NW. and SE.

Thence along W. slope.

38.80 Set an ironstone 16x12x6 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which:

A Red Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 18 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 B T.

A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears S.78*W., 5 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 B T.

78.61 Intersect temp. sec. cor. set at termination of random line bet. secs. 30 and 31.

78.80 A red fir, 7 ins. diam., for cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, I mark T 29 S S 30 on NE. R 6 W S 31 on SE.

S 36 on SW. and

R 7 W S 25 on NW. side, with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edge, from which
