

Re-Survey of South Boundary of T. 29 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

The course of this line is N.89°40'E., and the length is 39.08 chs.

Commencing at the $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. corner, I run S.89°54'E., bet. Secs. 6 and 31.

Ascend gradually along SW slope.

39.09 The corner of Secs. 5 and 6 on the S bdy. of the Tp., which is a post, greatly decayed, witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, bears N. 29 lks. dist.,

The course of this line is N.89°40'E., and the length is 39.09 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay and stony; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Red and White Fir, Sugar and Yellow Pine, Cedar.

Undergrowth, Pine, Fir, Oak, Arrowwood and Hazel.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 78.17 chs.

The line bet. Secs. 31 and 32 being out of limits with the line bet. Secs. 32 and 33, and the line bet. Secs. 29 and 32 being out of limits with the reported length of the S bdy. of Sec. 32, I commence at the cor. of Secs. 5 and 6 on the S bdy. of the Tp., already described.

Thence I run

S.89°54'E., on S bdy. of Sec. 31.

Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Ascend gradually along SW slope.

11.70 The cor. of Secs. 31 and 32 which I established July 30th, 1905.

Thence S.89°54'E., bet. Secs. 5 and 32.
