

Re-Survey of Subdivision Lines of T. 29 S. R. 6 W.

The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay and stony, 2nd. and 3rd rate.

Timber, red fir, sugar and yellow pine, cedar, laurel
and maple.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, arrowwood, hazel and fir

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with
dense undergrowth, 83.00 chs.

The line bet. secs. 29 and 32 being out of limits with
the reported length of the line bet. secs. 20 and 29,
I commence at the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 20 and 29,
heretofore described, which is 38.75 chs. dist. from
the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, course of line,
N.89*42'E.

Thence I run

N.89*42'E. bet. secs. 20 and 29.

Over mountainous land through scattering timber and dense
undergrowth.

Ascend W. slope.

38.95 Intersect cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29, which is an
oak post, 4 ins. sq. 20 ins. above ground, marked and
witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

The course of this line is N.89*42'E. and the length is
38.95 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, Clay, loam and stony, 2nd and 3rd. rate.

Timber, red fir, sugar and yellow pine, cedar, laurel,
oak.

Undergrowth, arrowwood, hazel, fir and oak.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered
with dense undergrowth, 38.95 chs.
