

Retracement of portion of South Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

Preliminary to beginning the subdivisions of the fractional township I retrace the South Boundary of sec. 36.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36,

I run

E. between secs. 1 and 36.

Ascend W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.00 Top of ridge, bears N. and S., 100 ft. above sec. cor.
Thence descend E. slope.

17.81 A ravine, course E., 75 ft. below top of ridge, thence over rolling land.

40.25 I fall 70 lks. N. of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a post, 4 ins. square, 12 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Therefore this line, W. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., is 40.25 chs. in length, and bears S.89°E.

I continue the retrace, from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner.

80.81 I fall 7 lks. N. of the cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 S., Rs. 6 and 7 W., which is a post, 4 ins. square, 12 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Land, mountainous and rolling.

Soil, stony, second and third rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Oak, Madrona, Maple, and Myrtle.

Undergrowth, Chinquapin and Willow.

June 29: Note: Sky overcast at noon; observation for latitude impossible.
