

Resurvey of the North Boundary of T. 30 S., R 8 W., W.M.

CHAINS

T 29 S S 31 on NE., R 8 W S 6 on SE., T 30 S S 1 on SW and R 9 W S 36 on NW faces, also six notches on each angle of same and from which

A Fir, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.34*E., 25 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 8 W S 31 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.48*E., 20 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 8 W S 6 B T.

A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.1*W., 19 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 9 W S 1 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.24*W., 38 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 9 W S 36 B T.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

This township is chiefly mountainous and densely covered with fir, pine, laurel and cedar timber. There are some rolling up-lands and narrow valleys, capable of cultivation. There being some four settlements made in different portions of the Township, it should be subdivided.
