

Retracement of Portion of S. bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 9, W

CHAINS

Set a Cedar post 3 feet long, 4 ins. sqr., 24 ins.,
in the ground marked

T 29 S S 34 on NE.,
T 30 S S 3 on S E.,
R 9 W S 4 on SW. and
S 33 on NW. faces, with 3 notches each on E.
and W. edges in place of old cor., from which

A fir, 30 ins, in diam. (Old B.T.) bears N. 70°E.,
33 lks. Marked T 29 S R 9 W S 34 B T

A fir, 30 ins. in diam. bears S. 45°E., 53 lks. dist.
Marked T 30 S R 9 W S 3 B T

(lks. omitted)
A fir, 6 ins. in diam. bears S. 80°W. ^ lks. dist.
Marked T 30 S R 9 W S 4 B T

A Hemlock, 8 ins. in diam. bears N. 45°W., 29 lks.
Dist. Marked T 29 S R 9 W S 33 B T

Land, high and rolling.

Soil, loam and clay 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock and Cedar.

Undergrowth, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Alder, Maple,

Sallal, Huckle and Thimble berry.

Mountainous land, or land heavily timbered or covered
with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult
to survey 80.18 chains.
