CHAINS

Nothing remains of the old corner but the stump of one of the bearing trees with the marks still upon it. I reestablish the corner for T. 30 S., R. 1 W. as follows: Set a basalt stone 15x12x6 ins., 10 ins. in ground for corner of T. 30 S., R. 1 W., marked with 6 notches on S. and W. edges; and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, SW. of corner. Pits impracticable. No trees -- limits.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, stoney, second class.
Timber, fir, pine and hemlock.
Undergrowth, laurel and huckleberry.
Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 87.00 chs.

As surveyed by Fred Mensch, Deputy Surveyor
Under Contract No. 757, dated September 14, 1904.

From the corner of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, I run North, 0°2'W. on a random line bet. secs. 2 and 3.
40.00 Set temp. ¼ sec. corner.
80.89 Intersect N. bdy. of the Tp. 40 lks. E. of the corner of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, which I re-established August 6, 1905. (See book of survey of N. bdy. of T 30 S, R 1 W., page 6).
Thence I run South, 0°19' E. on a true line bet. secs. 2 and 3. Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
Along W. slope.
8.60 Hunter's trail bears E. and W.
Desc. SW. slope.
25.75 Creek, 4 lks. wide, C. NW.
