

Resurvey of Subdivisions, T. 30 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T.

A hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears S.70*W., 44 lks.

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 7 B T.

The course of this line is N. and the length is 40.45 chs.

Commencing at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, I run

North, bet. secs. 7 and 8.

11.05 North fork of South Umpqua river, 50 lks. wide, C. SW.

Leave heavy timber, bears NE. and SW.

Asc. SE. slope.

26.30 Settlers' trail from Tiller bears NE. and SW.

40.55 The corner of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, which I re-established
August 10, 1905.

The course of this line is N. and the length is 40.55 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay, loam and stony, second and third rate.

Timber, red fir, sugar and yellow pine, cedar, hemlock;

undergrowth, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, fir and oak.

Mountainous land or heavily timbered land or land covered
with dense undergrowth, 81.00 chs.

The line bet. secs. 9 and 10 being out of limits with the
reported length of the line bet. secs. 10 and 11, I
commence at the corner of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15,
already described.

Thence, I run

North, bet. secs. 10 and 11.

Over mountainous land through scattering timber and
dense undergrowth.

Asc. S. slope.

19.25 Enter heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.

33.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, C. SE.

40.60 Intersect $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner which is a fir post 4 ins. sq.,
16 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described
